JOE O'TOOLE PRESENTED AT OUR MARCH MEETING

MARCH 21, 2016

Joe O'Toole, who is Director of the Sodus Bay Lighthouse Museum, gave an interesting talk on the Chimney Bluffs, Drumlins of Wayne County and the Prohibition Era. He discussed the glacier period and the evolution of drumlins across New York State from the receding glacial stones, clay and soil. Chimney Bluffs hass eroded each year by approximately three feet. O'Toole spoke of the passage of alcohol from Montreal to Kingston to Oswego and to places along Ontario Lake where the contraband alcohol made its way to local farmers and eventually to NYC.

Our April meeting will feature Bruce and Edie Farrington from Sodus Point, who will present life as it was on a farm in the 19th century.

Edith will be sharing with everyone insight that she has gleaned from reading the 7 diaries of her g-g-grandfather who was a small-time farmer in Wayne County in the later 1800's. We will be seeing details of what everyday life was like: differences in spoken & written language, education, diet and unusual weather patterns for these rural families in the years of 1874-1901. This presentation is in the format of a PowerPoint presentation and lasts for about 1 hour.

Edith taught for 30 years as an elementary school teacher in Hilton, NY and grew up in Clyde. She now lives in Sodus Point with her husband Bruce who is a former Project Manager at Xerox and now is the Village of Sodus Point historian.

The meeting will take place in the Lyons Public Library at 7:00. A business meeting will follow the presentation with refreshments in between.


