RESTORING THE COURTYARD: Mr. Arthur Santelli funds the

restoration of the Hotchkiss Building's piazza.

Many of you know how difficult it was on rainy days to battle the puddles and mud to get into the front door of the Hotchkiss Building, Well, thanks for our wonderful benefactor, Arthur Santelli, that should no longer be a problem. At the beginning of October, Arthur approached Dave and myself and offered to restore the courtyard in the front of our museum. This had been on our minds before, but other parts of restoration were

more important. We certainly accepted his most generous offer and in October, work began. What an opportune time with fewer visitors and the Leach Road Bridge out. The original Medina hewn stones were removed and stored while the area was excavated. Then, each stone was put back in place in a diamond design with gray pavers framing them. This is an amazing transformation of the courtyard! It also will help

tremendously with the drainage problem. We cannot thank Arthur enough for this wonderful improvement of the building.

I personally am thinking of the new uses for this courtyard, for instance a Clothes line Art Show or even a small café. Whatever use, it is such an amazing accomplishment in our ongoing restoration of this "gem "of a building.

GRANTS RECEIVED FOR WEBSITE

After the Lyons Heritage Society Board approved, Joan Wallis, Gehrig Lohrmann, Patty and Dave Alena attended a presentation in Geneva by a website company. The LHS Board voted that if the funds for a new website could be raised, we would hire the Geneva Inhouse Company to

A Bit of History by Robert MacDuffie

Hiram Gilbert Hotchkiss's Early Days

Leman Hotchkiss was born on June 29, 1875 in Connecticut. He married Theodosia Gilbert on June 19, 1809 and a little after one year they had their first son Hiram Gilbert Hotchkiss on July 19th 1910. Leman was operating a general store in Phelps, New York (Vienna). Three years later a second son was born, Leman Beecher Hotchkiss on February 3, 1813. Two months and a day later their mother, Theodosia died probably as a complication,

in childbirth as was common in those days. Thus, neither Hiram nor Leman ever knew their mother. (How many of us remember our life as a threeyear-old).

Faced with a new born and a three-year-old Leman married Theodosia's sister, Chloe Gilbert, on October 13, 1813 five months after the death of Theodosia. So the boys' aunt became their step-mother.
